



# Pathways to Reconciliation

A Summit

Call for Papers

Amman, Jordan 14–17 December 2009

---

**Hosted** by HRH Prince Hassan of Jordan and organized by Melbourne's RMIT and Monash Universities, the Summit is a response to the intensifying political violence and insecurity across the world. The unique objective of the summit is to explore alternative ways to peace focusing upon informal reconciliation processes. The Summit will bring together 200–300 delegates from around the world, including individuals who have made extraordinary contributions to reconciliation, representatives from NGOs, activist organizations and bodies such as the United Nations and the International Criminal Court, as well as academics and the media.

**Objectives** of the summit include the creation, or extension of support for, selected exemplary reconciliation projects, the inauguration of a Global Reconciliation Forum to support reconciliation processes, and the publication of a major book based on the conference proceedings.

**Patrons** include The Reverend Desmond Tutu, The Honourable Sir William Deane, Daw Aung San Suu Kyi, Dr Jose Ramos-Horta, Dr Bernard Lown, and Dr Lowitja O'Donoghue.
